NEW PENSION SYSTEM



The City of Phoenix Employees' Retirement System (COPERS) is implementing a new pension administration system which will allow us to better support our members.

During January and February of 2024, our Benefits Staff will be completing every process in both our current system and the new system to verify that everything is processing perfectly before going live in the new system on Mar. 1. We ask for your patience during this time. Appointments with our office will be limited to employees who are eligible to retire before July 1, 2024. If you are not eligible until after July 1, 2024, please reach out to us after Mar. 1.

We also ask for your patience regarding the timing of annual member statements. They will be processed from the new system and should be going out sometime in February of 2024. Thank you and we wish everyone a very Happy New Year!

We all know how great a fireplace can be on cool winter nights, especially during the holidays. However, during the winter Maricopa County has a problem with smoke. If the issue is not corrected and the smoke levels remain near the federal health



standards, Maricopa County could face burdensome federal regulations, possible fines, and a substantial health risk for our residents.

Please "Burn Cleaner, Burn Better," and on No Burn Days, don't burn wood.

If possible, use a gas or electric fireplace, convert your wood-burning fireplace to natural gas, or retrofit your fireplace with an air pollution reduction device.

The solid waste equipment operator (SWEO) in the Public Works Department operates solid waste collection trucks and other heavy equipment used for collecting refuse, recycling, and other waste material. Duties also include performing daily CDL pre-trip and post-trip inspections. Operators will be required to routinely climb in and out of equipment, perform light manual labor, provide customer service, and meet established performance standards.
