#### **BLACK HISTORY MONTH**



All month long, the City of Phoenix has commemorated Black History Month. As February wraps up, we want to highlight the first newspaper published by African Americans in Arizona: The Phoenix Tribune. The Arizona Gleam, Arizona Black Dispatch and Arizona Informant followed. These publications provided a voice for African Americans reporting on church life, social activities, activism, and preserving the history and legacy of its community.

Firefighter Recruit (written exam: March 26, 2024)

Fire recruit salary \$24.34 hourly/\$50,627 annually

Firefighter salary range is \$51,854 - \$76,626 annually (upon successful completion of the academy)

**Hiring Incentive**: The City is offering a \$7,500 hiring incentive to new hires who are currently certified paramedics which will be paid in accordance with A.R. 2.55.

Firefighter recruits are trained for fire suppression, emergency medical treatment, and hazard mitigation work in the Fire Department. Recruits are sent to the Phoenix Fire Department Training Academy for 14-16 weeks of basic recruit training followed by approximately nine months of structured probationary training and evaluation. Basic recruit training covers firefighting operations, emergency medical and transportation services, physical fitness, and other related subjects. After successfully completing the Academy, recruits become probationary firefighters.
