Did you know it costs about \$300 on average to get your taxes prepared by a professional? You can SAVE that money this tax season by using the City of Phoenix's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. There are three ways you can file for free:


- 1. **Do It Yourself**: Prepare your own state and federal tax returns using our free online software and get help from a VITA tax volunteer. (For individuals and families who make less than \$79,000/year.)
- 2. **In-Person Assistance**: Make an appointment to work with an IRS-certified tax preparer to file your returns. (For individuals and families who make less than \$64,000/year.)
- 3. <u>MyFreeTaxes.com</u>: Complete your own taxes for free online at home using a self-paced, step-by-step guide to file your returns. IRS-certified tax volunteers are available to help through online chat.

DID YOU KNOW

When it comes to your resume, it's important to include details about your accomplishments that can be measured. For example, avoid vague phrases like "team player" and instead highlight your accomplishments like "contributed to the XYZ project by leading X task and completing Y transactions. This decreased processing time for the City by up to 3.5 days." Providing detailed information helps support hiring leaders in evaluating candidates.
