Brief Recruitment and Hiring Blackout Ahead of Class & Comp Implementation on August 7

With the City's implementation of the <u>Classification</u> and <u>Compensation</u> study this fall, there will be a brief recruitment and hiring blackout period. Here are important dates to know:

- ♦ May 22 June 7: new job posting blackout
- July 7 Aug. 20: transaction blackout –
 individuals will not be able to start in a new role
 (new hire/promotion/transfer)
- Aug. 21: first potential start date after July 10 for transactions (new hires/transfers/promotions)
