

City of Phoenix COVID Vaccine Know Before You Go

- ◆ **Appointments are required** to receive a vaccine.
- ◆ If you've already received the first dose of the Pfizer COVID vaccine, your second dose will also be the Pfizer vaccine.
- ◆ The Employee Driver Training Academy (EDTA), 3535 S. 35th Ave., is not a drive-through vaccine site. Employees and/or household members will need to park and walk into the facility.
- ◆ You must have a copy of your appointment confirmation with you.
- ◆ Face coverings are required for everyone entering the facility.
- ◆ Temperature checks will be conducted for everyone entering the facility.

COVID-19 Vaccine Safety Award Incentive

All city employees who take the COVID-19 vaccine in 2021 and submit a completed COVID vaccine card, showing the dates of all required doses are eligible for a Vaccine Safety Award of \$75. For more information on how to receive the incentive, visit [COVID Safety Awards Procedures](#) online.

Employee COVID-19 Vaccine Location

The city's designated COVID-19 vaccine dispensing site for employees AND their household members 12 years and older is located at the city of Phoenix Employee Driver Training Academy (EDTA), 3535 S. 35th Ave., south of Lower Buckeye Road. COVID-19 Testing Opportunities

City of Phoenix employees can receive a COVID-19 test at the following locations:

- ◆ **City of Phoenix Employee Healthcare Clinic**, 1 N. Central Ave., testing available to employees, regardless of health plan, weekdays from 7 a.m. - 5:40 p.m., **by appointment only**. Click on the [Banner Health Clinic Link](#) and select "COVID Virus Testing – City of Phoenix."
- ◆ **Washington Activity Center (WAC) Test Site**, 2240 W. Citrus Way, offers free Rapid COVID tests for employees and their household members from 7 a.m. - 3:50 p.m. on Thursdays. Employees must call 602-534-0693 to schedule the tests for themselves and household members. This location is NOT a drive thru testing site.

Jobs of the Week

The Electrician Apprenticeship Program \$16.68 - \$21.58/hr

The Apprenticeship Program is a four-year program designed to result in apprentices becoming Electricians. Participation in the program requires apprentices to attend evening class once per week. Apprentices perform a variety of unskilled tasks while learning to maintain, repair and install electrical or electronic equipment and systems. At the beginning of the program, assignments are routine and as knowledge and skill increases, the complexity of assignments increases until performance and technical ability are at the journey level. Currently there are four vacancies in the program. Apprentices will rotate yearly between the Public Works, Aviation and Water departments. No prior experience or training is needed to start the program. The program's tentative start date is July 2021.

Apprentices must successfully and satisfactorily complete all assigned classroom and equipment training. After successful completion of the program, apprentices will promote into the Electrician classification, and serve a one-year city probationary period.

Requirements: Ability to read and comprehend written material at a level appropriate for the class. Must have High School Diploma or GED at the time of hire. Must successfully pass a math exam and perceive the full range of the color spectrum.
