

The Water Services Department is seeking a Maintenance Planner/Scheduler. This position plans and schedules work processes and vendors using a computerized maintenance management system (CMMS) under the direct supervision of the Water Services Utility Supervisor. The Maintenance Planner/ Scheduler plays a key role in improving the efficiency, quality, and productivity of work related to field safety, environmental compliance, and Water Distribution asset management. The Maintenance Planner/Scheduler supports management in planning, tracking, analysis, and reporting, including dashboard maintenance.

DID YOU KNOW

City of Phoenix employees can apply and compete for any opening where they meet the minimum qualifications of the position, regardless of the pay grade. Taking a job that is in a lower pay grade than your current job is called a demotion.

What does a demotion mean? This means being placed in the new job's salary grade at a rate that is typically lower than your current pay rate and then advancing through the steps in the new pay grade. A review of your qualifications will help determine your new pay rate.

Demotions can be an effective career advancement strategy by opening up a new field or industry where you can continue to grow professionally. Explore City job descriptions and pay grades here to help you decide whether a demotion is the right career move for you.
