COVID-19 Information

12 PHX Pools, Splash Pads to Open for Summer

The Parks and Recreation Department will operate the following 12 city pools this summer: Cortez, Deer Valley, El Prado, Encanto, Falcon, Maryvale, Paradise Valley, Pecos, Perry, Starlight, Sunnyslope and University.

Those pools will be open for the city's normal seasonal schedule – six days a week from May 29 - Aug. 1 (closed Fridays), and on Saturdays and Sundays only from Aug. 7 - Sep. 6. All city splash pads will also be open and follow the normal seasonal schedule this year: May 29 - Oct. 1.

Pools will operate at a reduced capacity, have modified open swim and swimming lesson formats and staff will follow an enhanced cleaning protocol. Youth age 17 and younger will receive free admission for open swim at all pools through the city's Kool Kids program. Swim and dive teams, the water basketball league, and other aquatics activities and special events will not be offered this summer.

City Park Amenities, Fields Reopen

A vote by the Phoenix City Council on March 16 approved the reopening of all city park amenities and sports complexes. They also approved all athletic field reservations and local tournaments (Arizona teams only) at facilities managed by the Parks and Recreation Department.

Participants, officials and spectators are required to follow various COVID-19 safety procedures: Do not use public recreational amenities if you are exhibiting symptoms of illness, wear a mask or face covering, bring your own wipes and hand sanitizer and keep a safe distance of six feet or more from others.

COVID Testing: Choose Your Options

Testing is important in our efforts to mitigate the COVID-19 pandemic because it helps prevent further spread. The city of Phoenix now offers four different COVID-19 testing services at no out-of-pocket cost to everyone in the community:

- *Mobile Testing Van #1* offers antigen tests and antibody tests, with results while you wait. Van #1 is in operation five days a week at different locations.
- *Mobile Testing Van #2* offers antigen tests with rapid results and PCR tests with result in 24 to 48 hours. Van #2 is in operation three days a week at different locations.
- *Maryvale Park Stationary Site* offers PCR tests with results in 24 hours. It is open three days a week at Maryvale Park, 4420 N. 51st Ave.
- *Drive-thru/Walk-up Sites* offers PCR tests with results in 24 to 48 hours. It is open on weekends at various locations.

Anyone, with or without medical insurance, is welcome to receive the city-sponsored COVID-19 testing services. Dates, times and locations: **Phoenix.gov/COVIDtesting**.

Safety Initiatives Earn Award

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Phoenix Sky Harbor, Phoenix Deer Valley and Phoenix Goodyear airports have employed a number of initiatives to ensure a safe, welcoming and healthy environment for those traveling through the airports. This includes a robust cleaning program, the installation of Plexiglass and UV-C LED sanitizing lights on escalator handrails and more.

As a results of these continuous efforts, the city of Phoenix Aviation Department was recently recognized in the GBAC STAR™ Facility Accreditation Program. All three airports received the accreditation. Phoenix Deer Valley and Phoenix Goodyear airports are the first general aviation airports in the U.S. to receive this accreditation. The Global Biorisk Advisory Council's GBAC STAR™ facility accreditation program is an outbreak prevention, response, and recovery accreditation for facilities. It represents a high level of achievement within the cleaning industry.
