Recycle Your Christmas Tree



Phoenix residents may drop off their live holiday/Christmas trees and wreaths for disposal anytime between Dec. 26, 2020 and Jan. 9, 2021. For a list of drop-off locations at Phoenix parks as well as designated private businesses, visit **Phoenix.gov/Recycle**.

Please remove all decorations, lights, tree stands and metal ornament hangers before dropping them off. They will then be delivered to the city's composting facility to be made into nutrient-rich compost by spring!

Burn Cleaner, Burn Better

While a fireplace can be comforting on a cool winter night, the smoke it emits may pose a substantial health risk to some residents across Maricopa County. On No Burn Days, please do not burn wood or you could face a fine. Consider converting your wood-burning fireplace to natural gas or retrofit your fireplace with an air pollution reduction



device. Call *602-372-WOOD* (*9663*) or visit **CleanAirMakeMore.com** to see if you qualify for a free device. You can also sign up for text and email alerts ahead of no burn days.

Keeping our environment clean is everyone's responsibility. To help reduce pollution in our stormwater drains, **Stormwater**

Awareness Week is Jan. 25-31, 2021.

There are many ways to reduce stormwater pollution, including: Don't dump anything down a storm drain, clean up after your pet, use car washes that recycles water and attend to vehicle leaks. Visit: **Phoenix.gov/Water**.

Winter Watering

Did you know you should adjust your irrigation at least four times a year? Seasonal adjustment of irrigation schedules is one of the most effective



ways to avoid overwatering. With cooler weather, outdoor plants and landscaping need less frequent watering to stay healthy. If you are changing your home landscaping, try low-water-use plants and plant a lawn only where needed.

FREE COVID-19 Mobile Testing
