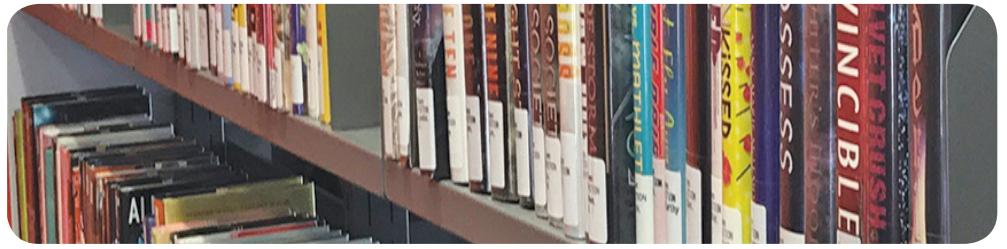

Phoenix Public Library @ Park Central



Phoenix Public Library @ Park Central will temporarily join Phoenix Public Library's 16 branch locations in providing robust library services, materials and programs. The temporary location will assist Phoenix customers who have been without a local library location due to the interim closure of Burton Barr Central Library. The 30,000 square foot location at 3121 N. 3rd Avenue has easy access to light rail, free parking, a nearby coffee shop and restaurants. Projected hours of operation will be:

- **Mondays, Fridays & Saturdays 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.**
- **Tuesdays, Wednesdays & Thursdays 9 a.m. – 9 p.m.**
- **Sundays 1:00 – 5:00 p.m.**

The temporary library location will contain thousands of library materials, access to computers, special programming for children and teens, as well as the library's College Depot and job assistance programs. Option for Water & Sewer Lines

Service Line Warranties of America (SLWA), a partner with the city of Phoenix, offers residents protection on their sewer and water lines that run from their private property line to the connection at the home. Over 500 cities now participate in the program. Since launching in Phoenix in 2012, more than 33,000 Phoenix homeowners have saved more than \$2.2 million through claims filed.

Phoenix homeowners recently received letters explaining how to enroll. For more information, call 602-262-4449 or visit slwofa.com. No public funds are used to promote or operate the program. SLWA is solely responsible for the administration and service of the warranty programs.



Remember to Recycle Safely

Even if the cylinders or aerosol containers seem empty, they should not be placed in the blue container. These items can be extremely dangerous.
