COVID-19 Information

Rental & Utility Assistance Help

City of Phoenix residents struggling to pay rent and utilities because of impacts from the COVID-19 pandemic can soon start applying for assistance from the city. The city recently received a second disbursement of funds from the federal government in the amount of \$51 million to help those living in the city limits with rent, electric, gas and water bills. The stipulations and application process for assistance will be launched in March. Once the program is active, information on how to apply will be available on **Phoenix.gov**.

Many New Options for COVID Testing

The city of Phoenix is committed to ensuring residents have options to receive COVID-19 testing with no out-of-pocket costs. Recently, a second mobile testing van was put into service and, like the original testing van,

it changes locations daily to be accessible to residents across Phoenix. In addition to the vans, the city now operates a stationary location at Maryvale Park, 4420 N. 51st Ave., Phoenix, AZ 85031.

Virtual Community Budget Hearings

The City Manager's Trial Budget and Preliminary Capital Improvement Program (CIP) will be presented to City Council on March 16, 2021. We invite you to try out *FundPHX*, the city's interactive budgeting tool that makes it easy to show us what programs and services you would like to see included in the upcoming 2021-22 budget. In April, you can provide input during one of several virtual community budget hearings, including a meeting in Spanish.

Spring Cleaning with Public Works

To properly dispose of no-longer-used items or trash piles, please consider the following services:

• Bulk Trash Pick-Up: Materials that are too large to fit in your trash container can be collected as bulk trash every quarter. Make sure to follow the guidelines on placement of materials and what materials are accepted.



- Free Disposal at Transfer Stations: Phoenix residents can simply present a current city services bill with solid waste fees and matching photo I.D. with name or address at either of the city-owned transfer stations, for a free disposal, up to one ton, every calendar month.
- Eco Stations: Break it down and recycle those cardboard boxes! If you have a lot of boxes to recycle that won't fit in your recycling container, find the nearest Eco Station near you, where clean and unbagged recyclables are accepted.
- Appliance Recycling: Public Works offers appliance pick-ups for a minimal fee. You can schedule a pick-up for your old appliances, such as refrigerators, non-refrigerant appliances and up to two CRT or non-CRT televisions.
- Dumpster Rental: You can rent a dumpster for your large piles of trash and unwanted items. For a single rental fee, plus the weight of what you throw out, the city offers a 10-day placement of the roll-off dumpster in the size that fits your needs.
