Kate Gallego Sworn in as New Mayor

On March 12, former city Councilwoman Kate Gallego was elected Mayor of the city of Phoenix. She is only the second woman to be elected to the job; and only the third woman to ever serve in the role as Mayor of the nation's fifth largest city.

Mayor Gallego stated, "I'm beyond excited to be back at the city of Phoenix and have already begun working on improving education, creating more jobs, safer neighborhoods and on investing in our city's infrastructure."

An inauguration ceremony was held on Thursday, March 21 inside the city's iconic Orpheum Theatre. Mayor Gallego was elected in a Special Election to fill the vacancy left behind by now-Congressman Greg Stanton. She will serve out the remainder of his term, which ends in April of 2021.

Runoff Election for Districts 5 and 8


A Runoff Election is scheduled for May 21, 2019. This election is required because during the recent Special Election for Council districts 5 and 8, no one candidate received the majority of the votes (50% plus 1) in either district. Therefore, the top two candidates who received the most votes in each race will now appear on the ballot for the runoff in May. Some important election-related dates:

- Deadline to register to vote: April 22, 2019
- Deadline to request an early ballot: May 10, 2019

Voters will also be able to vote at designated Voting Centers. Details on dates, times and locations will soon be available on **Phoenix.gov/Elections**.
