Back to School Safety Reminders With most schools now back in session, pedestrians and motorists are reminded to play it safe when near and within school zones. Drivers are advised to obey speed limits and to yield to pedestrians at all crosswalks,



as well as when making a right or left turn at intersections. Remember, it is illegal to pass a school bus that is stopped with flashing red lights, meaning kids are getting on and off

As for pedestrians, they are asked to pay attention when crossing streets and avoid distractions such as electronic devices. It's always a good idea to stop and make eye contact with the driver before stepping off the curb. Pedestrians should cross where there are traffic signals or crosswalks and avoid crossing midblock.



Get Out the Vote on August 28

On Tuesday, Aug. 28, Phoenix voters will decide on six propositions that will be on the ballot for the State Primary Election, being conducted by Maricopa County. Details about the propositions can be found at Phoenix.gov/Elections or by calling 602-261-VOTE (8683) or the 7-1-1 Relay System.

Polling places will be open 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Election Day. Information about where

to vote will be on the County-mailed Sample Ballot and online at Locations.Maricopa.Vote.



early ballot by mail is Friday, Aug. 17. Completed early ballots may be mailed, or delivered to any polling place in Maricopa County, but must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day.

Safety First: Check Your Car Seats



Did you know: 4 out of 5 child car seats are installed incorrectly? Or that 1/3 of children are riding in the wrong restraints for their age and size? The city of Phoenix Fire Department has four "fitting locations" where trained firefighters can check to make sure your car seat is properly installed. You must make a reservation for a car seat inspection or installation and you provide the car seat. Call *602-495-KIDS*. Locations are open 8 a.m. - noon on the days listed:
