Phoenix Public Library: Check out *Tumble Books* which are talking picture books, *Storytime Online* features children's authors and celebrities reading to kids and *Kanopy Kids* streams child-friendly videos & movies. 2020 Census Count Continues!

While many city services, schools and private businesses are impacted by the #Coronavirus national emergency, the 2020 Census is still happening, and everyone can complete their Census from their homes!

In March, households were mailed information on three ways to participate: online, by phone or by mail. Only one person per household needs to fill out the Census with information about everyone living in the home, regardless of relationship to each other.

You are encouraged to self-respond to the 2020 Census by April 30, 2020. Starting in May, the Census Bureau will begin in-person follow-ups to households who haven't responded. All Census responses need to be received no later than August 14, 2020. **Remember:** *If you connect with a Census worker, they will never ask for social security numbers, bank account numbers, money, or donations.*

The results from the U.S. Census helps to distribute \$675 billion in federal funds to support programs in education, healthcare, transportation, parks and recreation services and other important local resources. Counting everyone in your household is your opportunity to help our community receive funding. iCount2020.info.

Help prevent the spread of respiratory diseases like COVID-19.

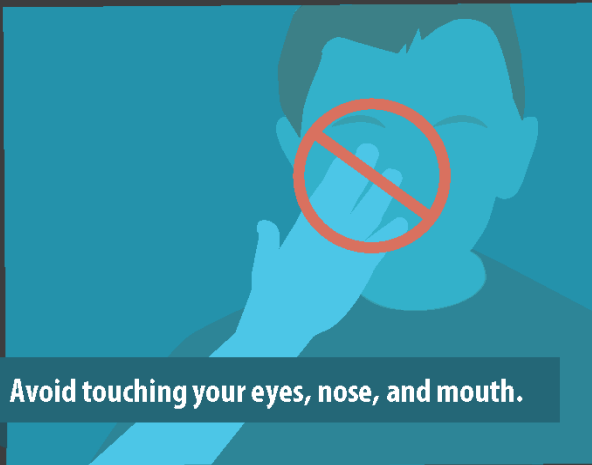
Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
