## ST VOTE IS YOUR August 27: Special Election

The city of Phoenix will hold a Special Election on two propositions related to light rail and city pensions on Tuesday, Aug. 27. Early voting is open weekdays through Aug. 23 at Phoenix City Hall. Voting centers will be open:

- Saturday, Aug. 24: 10 a.m. 4 p.m.
- Monday, Aug. 26: 9 a.m. 6 p.m.
- Tuesday, Aug. 27: 6 a.m. 7 p.m.

Mail-in Early Ballots must be received by 7 p.m. on Aug. 27 in order to be counted. Election results will be available on **Phoenix.gov/Results** after 8 p.m. on Aug. 27. Get your elections questions answered at **Phoenix.gov/Elections**.

Eleven of Phoenix's public pools are open on weekends only through Labor Day, Monday Sept. 2. Public Works collects trash and recycling as regularly scheduled on the following holidays: MLK Day, Presidents' Day, Cesar Chavez Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Veterans Day. As a reminder, please place your trash and recycling containers at the curb by 5:30 a.m. and keep them 4 feet apart from each other. ## **Coming Soon: Giving Meters**

The finishing touches are being put on the city's new Giving Meters. These re-purposed parking meters, with the help of Downtown Phoenix Partnership, are decorated by local artists and will be placed on sidewalks in high foot traffic areas in downtown Phoenix. Donations can be made with cash, coins or credit cards. The money will help those experiencing homelessness through supported services. Look for the meters soon! Phoenix renters need to know that providing reasonable cooling to your housing unit is the responsibility of the landlord. The city of Phoenix's ordinance says minimum temperature requirements in all rental housing units must be no greater than 82 degrees if cooled by air conditioning and 86 degrees if cooled by evaporative cooling.

The city's Neighborhood Services Department runs the Landord Tenant program, which can help you understand your rights and show you how to hold your landlords accountable. If you've already tried to resolve an issue with your landlord but were not successful, call the Landlord Tenant hotline at 602-534-4444.

Ever wonder what happens to your recyclables, and if they actually get recycled? Public Works' Zero Waste Team has an answer for you; through a new video tour of the city's recycling facility. The video tour is led by a Zero Waste Team member, who takes viewers from the time recyclables arrive at the transfer station, guides you through every step of the recycling process, until recyclables are baled and transported to different manufacturing facilities all over the world.
