Phoenix Requires Face Coverings

As of press time, all persons over the age of two are required to wear face coverings in public by order of the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors. This order is designed to help slow the spread of COVID-19 and affects all of Maricopa county, including Phoenix. A face covering is any type of fabric or cloth that can safely cover your nose and mouth. These can be store-bought (mask, scarf or bandana) or home-made using traditional fabrics (cotton, poly-blends, etc.) Visit CDC.gov for instructions on how to make your own face covering. When you arrive, you will notice safety precautions put in place to ensure physical distancing. This includes plexiglass barriers at service counters, sanitizer stations and the requirement of wearing masks or face coverings when in any city building. Important 2020 Election Dates

Aug. 4, 2020: No city of Phoenix items are on this ballot. This is the statewide Primary Election being conducted by Maricopa County.



Nov. 3, 2020: A Phoenix Mayor and Council Election for Districts 1, 3, 5, and 7 will be held on this date along with a proposition related to the Alternative Expenditure Limitation (Home Rule). These items will appear on the ballot for the General Election being conducted by Maricopa County.

March 9, 2021: If no candidate for a race receives a majority of the votes cast in the Nov. 2020 Election, a runoff election will occur for that office on this date. This election will be conducted by the city of Phoenix. More information about these elections can be found at Phoenix.gov/Elections.

For all elections, changes to voter registration must be requested through Maricopa County. To check your registration, go to BeBallotReady.Vote or call 602-506-1511.

How Much Water do You Use?

Showers, dishwashing, laundry, toilet flushes, landscaping, and pools contribute to the city's water usage in your home. Use the water calculator to help you better understand your water usage. **Phoenix.gov/Waterservices/Usage-Calculator.**

Enter information about your household and the calculator will provide your optimal monthly water usage. It takes into account family size, watering outside the home, dishwashers, and more. Resources are also available to help you conserve water and save on your bill. Be aware the calculator produces an estimate and actual usage may vary.




Phoenix Light Rail is on Track

Phoenix light rail extensions continue to see great progress. Construction on the South Central Extension/Downtown Hub is under way in downtown and recently broke ground in south Phoenix. Construction begins mid-August for the Northwest Extension Phase II, and thanks to input from hundreds of community members the Capitol/I-10 West Extension will soon enter the design phase. Tackle These Recycling Challenges

This summer remember these recyling tips:

- Break down cardboard boxes: Cardboard is a valuable commodity as package delivery becomes the norm. To fit more cardboard boxes in your blue container, break them down to make room for your other recyclables.
- DO NOT place plastic grocery bags in your recycling container: Consider recycling these bags at home by reusing them as small trash can liners or pet waste bags.
 Exception: Stuffing shredded paper in clear plastic bags before placing in the recycling container is allowed.
- Support local businesses: Especially, our Green Business Leaders, who operate
