Special Election Set for March 12



On Tuesday, March 12, 2019, the city of Phoenix will conduct a Mayoral Runoff Election and a Special Vacancy Election for Council members in Council Districts 5 and 8. The voter registration deadline is Monday, Feb. 11.

Voters on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL) will automatically receive an early ballot by mail, unless they requested not to receive a

ballot by mail for this election. Voters not on the PEVL can request an early ballot by mail, no later than Friday, March 1, by visiting **Phoenix.gov/Elections** or calling *602-261-VOTE* (*8683*). Early ballots will be mailed on Feb. 13.

In-person early voting will be available on the 15th floor of Phoenix City Hall between Wednesday, Feb. 13 and Friday, March 8, during regular business hours. Accessible voting devices allowing voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available there.

Another Option for Your Bulk Trash

As a city of Phoenix customer paying for monthly solid waste fees, did you know you can take one load, of up to one ton of materials each calendar month, to dispose at a city transfer station at no charge? You must bring a current copy of your city services bill or your account number, along with a matching photo ID. Loads can be taken to the transfer stations weekdays 5:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. and Saturdays 6 a.m. - 3 p.m.

Do You Live in a Flood Hazard Zone?

Is your home or business in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA)? If so, you may want to consider purchasing flood insurance. You may also apply for flood insurance even if you are not in a SFHA to reduce the cost of damages caused by localized flooding.



To find out if there is an elevation certificate on file for your property, which calculates your flood insurance policy risk, or to see if your property is in a SFHA, call *602-262-4960* or visit Floodplain Management at Phoenix City Hall, 200 West Washington Street, 5th Floor, Phoenix, AZ, 85003.

In addition to flood insurance, you can make a list of personal property, take photos of your property to assist your insurance adjuster and keep all important information and electronics in a safe and dry place.
