Tis' the Season ...

Keep your plumbing clean this holiday season by properly disposing of fats, oil and grease (FOG) this holiday season:

- Store It: Once cooled, use a coffee filter, cheese cloth or strainer to siphon grease into a container and store in the refrigerator.
- **Scrape It:** Scrape all scraps from dishes into the trash before washing.
- *Trash It:* Pour into small, sealable containers before disposal.

Try to throw away only small amounts at a time, as big jugs can leak, making a mess of the city's collection trucks and disposal facilities.

Christmas & New Year's Day: On both Christmas, Wednesday, Dec. 25, and New Year's Day, Wednesday, Jan. 1, 2020, there will be no pick-ups. On those weeks, here's how pick-ups will adjust:

- Wednesday → Thursday
- Thursday → Friday
- Friday → Saturday
