### PHOENIX WATER PORTFOLIO


Phoenix has been designated by the State as having a 100-year assured water supply. To prepare for drought, we have developed a diverse portfolio of water supplies that includes Salt, Verde, and Colorado River water, groundwater reserves, and reclaimed wastewater for non-potable purposes. Phoenix currently uses only around half of its Salt & Verde River water supplies, and around 2/3 of its Colorado River water supplies. This creates a buffer between supplies and demand that Phoenix can rely on during times of drought and surface water shortage. Learn more here: WaterWorks.Phoenix.gov/Why

### CITY GROWTH WITH EFFECTIVE WATER DEMAND MANAGEMENT

Phoenix's residential gallons per capita per day (GPCD) use of water has been reduced by 30% over the last 30 years. Phoenix customers used less water in 2020 than in 1996, even with an increase of more than 400,000 residents.
