New Water Rates in Effect

New water rates in the city of Phoenix went into effect Oct. 1, 2021. Your bill will reflect a rate increase that was approved by the Phoenix City Council in March of this year in order to continue to provide safe, reliable drinking water and ensure infrastructure that is responsive to drought.

Low Flow Program Resumes

Customers with past-due City Services bills will have until Oct. 31, 2021, to make a payment to their account to place the account in good standing. If the account is still past due beginning Nov. 1, 2021, the customer will be placed in the *Low Flow Program*.

The low flow device will be installed for no more than three months while customers work to get back on track. Following the installment of the low flow device, customers will have three months to make payments towards their account to place them in good standing before water service is turned off. "I Recycle PHX" Festival Returns

Phoenix Public Works and Keep Phoenix Beautiful are excited to announce the return of the "I Recycle PHX" festival. The first event since the COVID-19 pandemic began will be held 7 a.m. - noon, Saturday, Oct. 16, at the Desert Ridge Marketplace. If you miss this one, don't worry – several more are being scheduled. Community partners will be on hand to accept many items, including: hard drives, laptops, computer towers, printers, cell phones, flat screen televisions and monitors, bicycles, non-perishable food, clothing, unopened personal care products, books, office and school supplies and housewares.

Personal documents can be shredded onsite, up to five boxes for free. Additional boxes can be shredded for either a monetary or non-perishable food donation. On-site shredding will be offered until the truck is full. Any additional materials collected will be securely shredded offsite. The event will follow health and safety protocols as people will be asked to stay in their vehicles while masked-up volunteers do all the heavy lifting.

Volunteers Needed for Tax Season

The city of Phoenix Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program is looking for volunteers to help low-to-limited income taxpayers file their taxes. Don't worry, no tax

preparation experience is necessary! Over the last 17 years, VITA volunteers have assisted clients in obtaining over \$100 million dollars in tax refunds.

VITA volunteers receive free training on how to prepare and e-file tax returns for taxpayers helping them save hundreds of dollars in paid preparer fees. This free service helps ensure a



taxpayer's income, deductions and allowable credits are claimed.
