

The City of Phoenix is partnering with Common Sense Media and Arizona State University to provide low-income households



*What's on the Ballot?* All registered Phoenix voters residing in Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8, will elect a Councilmember to fill a four-year term on Nov. 8.

**How Can I Vote in This Election?** 



- Vote in-person starting Oct. 12 at any Maricopa County voting location. This
  option is available to ALL registered voters. Make sure to bring identification.
- Drop off your signed early ballot at any of the Maricopa County voting locations.

*When Does Voting Begin?* In-person voting starts the same day as mailing for early ballots – Wednesday, Oct. 12.

# **PHX Named All-America City**

The National Civic League and the Campaign for Grade-Level Reading named the City of Phoenix as a winner of the 2022 All-America City awards for its commitment to improving digital equity and education in underserved areas. Phoenix is one of the most honored U.S. cities, winning the All-America City designation six times: 1950, 1958, 1980, 1989, 2009 and 2022.



## **GO Bond: Next Steps Start Soon**

The City's General Obligation (GO) Bond Committee process continues this month with each subcommittee proposing recommendations to the Executive Committee. Subcommittees will propose their list of prioritized projects, and the committee is charged with identifying the highest priority projects totaling the \$500 million GO Bond Program scope approved by Phoenix City Council. ## CAMPAIGN ACCOMPLISHMENTS

### ANNUAL DONATION DRIVE

Collected more than 30k items including toiletries, cleaning supplies, new clothing, pet items and prepaid cell phones for local shelters through an annual donation drive, in conjunction with the Arizona Coalition to End Sexual and Domestic Violence (ACESDV).



### **HOSTED OUTREACH EVENTS**

Reached more than 75k students through outreach
events at local high schools with lunch time
resource fairs, football and volleyball games, and
classroom trainings.



### **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS**

Created and distributed more than 180k resources to community partners with information on local shelters, safety planning, and identifying domestic violence.



### **FAMILY ADVOCACY CENTER**

In February 2016, the City of Phoenix's Family Advocacy Center (FAC) received Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding from the Arizona Department of Public Safety to implement a mobile victim advocacy project, allowing the expansion of service delivery beyond the walls of the FAC.
