The COVID-19 Testing Van offers viral and antibody tests administered by the medical professionals from Vincere

interior is customized to safely

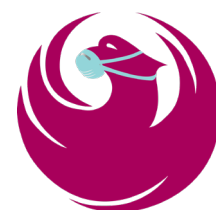
accommodate medical supplies and test kits. Depending on the type of test administered, results may be received as quickly as 15 minutes or in two to 10 days.

The city of Phoenix continues to require a face covering for anyone two and older when in public. This is in accordance with guidelines issued by the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors. A face covering is any type of fabric or cloth that safely covers your nose and mouth.

Grant Assistance: Get Up to \$5,000

Phoenix is offering grants worth up to \$5,000 for microbusinesses, including home businesses and solo practitioners working from home or in a shared office space. Grants do not have to be paid back if the money is applied to any legitimate business expense. Check out eligibility requirements at **Phoenix.gov/Resources**.

Financial assistance is also available to businesses for their city services bill. Start by visiting **Phoenix.gov/Resources**. For commercial businesses, look under the "for businesses" tab. For home-based companies, select "Residential Grants."

Election Day 2020

When is Election Day?

Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020.

What's on the Ballot?

City of Phoenix registered voters will elect a Mayor and will decide on a ballot measure related to the Alternative Expenditure Limitation (Home Rule). Registered voters residing in Districts 1, 3, 5, and 7 will also elect Council Members. The Mayor and Council Members elected will serve a four-year term to begin on April 19, 2021.

When is the Voter Registration Deadline?

Monday, Oct. 5, 2020.

When is Early Voting by Mail?

Early ballots will be mailed on Wednesday, Oct. 7. Voters not on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL) can request an early ballot by mail by visiting **Request.Maricopa.Vote** or calling 602-506-1511 no later than Friday, Oct. 23.

How do I Track My Early Ballot Status?

Visit **BeBallotReady.vote**.

When is In-person Early Voting?

Wednesday, Oct. 7 through Friday, Oct. 30. To find a voting center near you, visit: **Locations.Maricopa.Vote**. Accessible voting devices will be available at these sites. You do not have to be on the PEVL to vote early in person, all registered voters can vote early in person – just bring your identification!

Bulk Trash Pick-up Reminders

- Place your piles close to the edge of your property. Our crews cannot pick up bulk trash placed near fixed objects or far into private property.
- Amount of bulk trash should be smaller than the size of an SUV (20 cubic yards).
- Loose yard waste must be bagged. Larger yard waste, such as tree trimmings, must be chopped down to less than 12" in diameter and 4' in length.
- If you just have a small pile of bulky trash, consider disposing it in your regular trash containers. Bag and tie all trash materials.
- Small piles of recyclable items, such as cardboard, can be broken down and placed in your residential blue container.
