LEADERSHIP FORUM





Did you know that it has been 20 years since Phoenix's historic Orpheum Theatre reopened after a 12-year, \$14M restoration project? On Jan. 28, 1997, the theater reopened to the delight of local residents who held fond memories of the historic venue. The Orpheum, a cherished community landmark, was purchased by the city of Phoenix in 1984 and placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1985 when the theater closed to undergo a massive renovation to restore the venue back to its original grandeur. The restoration received support from many organizations and private residents and reopened with Carol Channing starring in a performance of Hello Dolly. Over the last two decades, the venue has hosted shows by notable performers including Lily Tomlin, Bryan Adams, Lewis Black, Boz Scaggs, Eddie Izzard, Jimmy Fallon, David Feherty, Adam Carolla and others. The Orpheum Theatre, which opened in 1929, will celebrate its 90th Anniversary in 2019.
