The city of Phoenix celebrates Earth Day by making the entire month of April, Earth Month. The city has a waste diversion goal of 40 percent by 2020, but City Hall has an even more ambitious goal of a 60 percent waste diversion rate! To remind you to recycle right, Public Works will provide waste diversion tips in a work setting for the entire month of April.




Waste diversion tip for the week: Recycling paper, cardboard, mail and food boxes.

- Items like cardboard, mail, food boxes and scrap paper can be placed in the blue recycling containers in the office.
- For larger items such as cardboard, remember to flatten them before placing them in the recycling containers.
- The blank sides of papers and flyers can be used as scratch paper.
- Cardboard boxes can be reused to send packages or as storage containers.
- When printing, make sure that your settings allow you to print on both sides of the paper.


