Central City Precinct, Possession of Narcotic drugs for sale, 1300 West Madison street, 09-21-2021, 1100 hours, IR# 2021-1474185, Sgt. Hammond 51X

On September 21, 2021 at 0915 hours the 51X squad arrested a known subject with an outstanding felony warrant at 12th avenue and Madison street. During that arrest information was gathered regarding a large quantity of methamphetamines and a firearm at a nearby location.

NET officers met with DOU shelter squad officers who coordinated a subject stop of the listed subject for multiple violations of city code including trespassing and blocking the sidewalk. Upon approach officers observed stolen Trafficade plates being used by the suspect to secure his campsite area, several examples of drug paraphernalia in plain view including syringes and several 1 inch Ziploc baggies, and an alcohol bottle with security cap still in place. Officers arrested the subject for possession of stolen property and coordinated the safekeeping impounding of the campsite items in accordance with departmental policy. During the inventory search of the makeshift campsite, the listed items were discovered, 329 grams of Methamphetamines, over 300 Fentanyl pills, 1749.00 in cash, and 1 defaced 9mm high point handgun. Patrol 56 was on advised, NET took dispo.

South Mountain Precinct, Sale of Narcotic and Dangerous Drugs, 5630 S 9th St #108, 1537 hours, IR# 2021-1591883, Sergeant Garman-Coppock, 52X

On October 7, 2021, Walking Beat officers were provided a Silent Witness tip regarding an outstanding 10-51, Doug Shubin, selling various types of drugs at 5630 S. 9th St. Apt 108. The 10-51 was the result of a prior Walking Beat initiated investigation. On October 8, 2021, officers from Walking Beat and 51X began conducting surveillance at the listed address.

On October 12, 2021, 51X officers conducted surveillance while activity stops were conducted by Walking Beat and 500 CAO's, and probable cause was established and a search warrant was drafted for various drugs as well as the target. SAU executed the search warrant and AP Shubin was taken into custody. While processing the search warrant, drugs, a firearm, and money (\$1375.00) were seized.

Doug was charged with PODD (29.8 grams methamphetamines) for sales, POND (22.5 grams heroin and 546 fentanyl pills) x 2 for sales, MIW, and his 10-51.

September Employee of the Month

On June 24, 2021 Officers Madrigal, Melvin, Moody and Schoon responded to a radio call of a suspect in a black pickup truck chasing, and attempting to shoot, a UPS driver near 19th Drive and Pima Street. The victim (UPS Driver) advised he had stopped his vehicle at 19th Avenue and Lower Buckeye Road. Officer Schoon contacted the victim at that location and interviewed him. The victim stated he had been making deliveries near 19th Avenue and Pima Street when he accidentally cut off a subject who was driving in a black pickup truck. The victim attempted to apologize and continued on to make his deliveries. The unknown suspect drove up alongside the victim and aimed a handgun at him. The victim drove away, and the suspect gave chase, firing one round at the victim and missing, hitting the UPS truck. Officer Schoon quickly provided updated information on the radio including the description of the suspect and his vehicle. Officers Madrigal, Moody and Melvin responded to the original scene to secure it and to conduct a search for other evidence and possible victims. Police Assistant Solorio processed the original scene.

A radio call was broadcast in the South Mountain Precinct of a black Nissan Titan pickup truck speeding in the area and Officers Curry, Brown, Lieder, and Taylor responded to the area along with Officers Clark and Kriss in the air unit. Officer Curry arrived and observed a truck matching the description was parked in the area and observed the driver exit the suspect vehicle and advised over the radio. As he watched he observed the driver matched the suspect's description shortly before the suspect withdrew a handgun and aimed it at the air unit. Officers Clark and Kriss also recognized the suspect had aimed the handgun at them as Officers Curry, Brown, Lieder and Taylor began giving the suspect commands he refused to obey and instead re-entered the vehicle and drove away. The air unit followed him to a Walmart parking lot at 35th Avenue and Southern, as this was an area with multiple potential victims, officers initiated a high risk stop to ensure the suspect could not enter the store and harm anyone.

The suspect exited the vehicle but refused to comply with commands. Officer Donovan deployed two stun-bag rounds striking the suspect, which motivated him to comply with commands and the officers arrested him. No firearms or spent shell casings were recovered from the initial scene, nor from the search incident to arrest of the suspect vehicle. Officer Horst did locate a live cartridge inside the vehicle. Officers secured the firearm the suspect had thrown out the window of his truck while fleeing from the officers, after a witness whose yard it had landed in flagged them down. Officer Moody processed the suspect for DUI as he exhibited signs of impairment when contacted. Motor Officer Reeves assisted in the DUI investigation by drafting a search warrant and executing a blood draw. The suspect was booked for three counts of Aggravated Assault, Misconduct Involving Weapons – Prohibited Possessor, Discharge a Firearm within City Limits, Disorderly Conduct, and Aggravated DUI.

**Kids Skull Candy Workshop
Ranch Market**



During the celebration of Dia de Los Muertos (the Day of the Dead), sugar skulls are often used to decorate the *ofrendas* (offerings), and they are exactly what their name describes: skull-shaped sugar.

Smaller skulls are placed on the ofrenda on November 1st to represent the children who have deceased. On November 2nd they are replaced by larger, more ornate skulls that represent the adults. These decorative skulls have the name of the deceased on the forehead and are decorated with stripes, dots, and swirls of icing to enhance the features of the skulls. These designs are usually whimsical and brightly colored, not morbid or scary. Feathers, beads, or colored foils are "glued"

This is a great opportunity for young people to volunteer.


