
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
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
2018 Facts-at-a-Glance

This is a detailed analysis of the raw data from collisions in the City of Phoenix during 2018:


- Total of 30,575 collisions resulting in 12,450 injuries and 218 fatalities.
- Eighty-two percent of all crashes were either rear end, angle, sideswipe or left turn.
- Pedestrian collisions reached a ten year high of 772 incidents with 659 injuries and 105 fatalities.









Locations with the Highest Number of Collisions 2018
















2018 Rush Hour related crashes were 41% of total injuries and 19% of total fatalities





















- 1 "Speed Too Fast" does not necessarily mean the person was exceeding the speed limit but rather the person was traveling too fast for the conditions at the time.
- 2 "Unknown" includes leaving the scene, conflicting statements without witnesses, incapacitated persons.
- 3 "Other" includes less common violations such as Unsafe Passing and Operating with Faulty Equipment.
- 4 "None" refers to drivers involved in a crash without committing a violation. These instances are usually the result of uncontrollable forces such as falling objects, debris or animals in the roadway.










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

















Citywide LED Street Light conversion




Traffic Safety education

Summary

- Seventy-Two percent of all collisions resulted in property damage only.
- Approximately 34 people were injured every day as a result of traffic crashes.
- Thirty-three percent of pedestrian collisions involved the pedestrian not using the crosswalk.
- Bicyclist collisions decreased from **490** in 2017 to **377** in 2018.

Collision data utilized for this report was acquired through Phoenix Police records and the database maintained by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) known as Safety Data Mart (SDM). The SDM database includes motor vehicle crashes that occurred on public right of way where someone was injured, killed or property damage exceeded \$1,000.
