Parks and Recreation Department: Highlight

North Mountain Visitors Center

The Park Steward program works throughout the City of Phoenix to help maintain and beautify the 41,000 acres of preserve land and trails. Over the last year Park Ranger Greg Jones has worked with volunteers from the Arizona Sustainability Alliance, Eagle Scout Aiden Hinz, save our Mountains Foundation and numerous Park Stewards to completely restore the parking lot area at the North Mountain Visitors Center.

The North Mountain Revitalization project has been ongoing since September of 2018 and has entailed many facets of work. The volunteers removed various species of invasive plants and trees that deprive natural flora of water and resources, made worse by the supper bloom in spring. Volunteers also trimmed trees to raise the canopy to protect them from fire and increase visibility for security within the trailhead and parking area. Additional work included thinning brush to reduce fire fuels and to reveal flora that had been obscured by the over growth. For more information contact Josh Parnell at josh.parnell@phoenix.gov.
