Road Restoration Rescheduled: Northern Avenue from Cheryl Drive to 26th Street

The City of Phoenix has contracted with Kiewit Corporation and Garney Construction to install the Drought Pipeline between 20th Street and Orangewood Avenue and 32nd Street and Shea Boulevard.



Drought Pipeline Project:

Phoenix Water is building new pipelines and pump stations to ensure all customers will have access to safe, clean and reliable drinking water for generations to come. These improvements will help to move water supplies during water shortages along the Colorado River.

- Working hours will primarily be May 1 September 30: 6 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Saturday and October 1 – April 30: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Some construction may require night or Sunday work.
- Business, residential and pedestrian access will be maintained.
- No on-street parking will be allowed in the construction area.

Current Construction Activities:

Road restoration has been rescheduled on Northern Avenue from Cheryl Drive to 26th Street. Work is currently scheduled for the week of February 20, 2023.

- Paving is scheduled for Northern Avenue, North of 26th Street at the tunneling/boring pit the week of February 20, 2023.
- Northern Avenue scheduled to reopen to through traffic after February 27, 2023.
- Upon completion of paving an application of micro seal, a high-performance resurfacing treatment that provides an additional wear surface will be applied on Northern Avenue from Cheryl Drive to 26th Street starting February 27 through March 4, 2023.
- Business and residential access will be maintained.
- In active micro seal on Northern Avenue traffic will be restricted to 1 lane.
- Crews will assist with traffic control.
- Drivers should slow down, proceed through the work zone with caution and watch for construction personnel and equipment.
- After the material is placed, do not drive on it until cones or barricades have been removed.

Construction schedules are subject to change for a variety of reasons, including weather and personnel/material availability. The City of Phoenix and its contractors recognize the inconvenience of construction and we thank you for your patience and support!



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
