

Drought Pipeline Project Ongoing Safety Awareness

- Work areas and excavations will be fenced and secure. The fencing will provide a visual barrier.
- All gates will be closed and locked outside of working hours.
- Trenches across driveways will be covered with steel plates to maintain driveway access.
- Traffic control signs and barriers will be clear and organized.
- There will be designated pedestrian walkways provided when sidewalks are impacted by construction work.
- Dust control is required and is accomplished by water trucks.
- There will be some noise during daytime work hours—there will not be unnecessary noise.
- We are coordinating closely with the Police and Fire Departments—emergency access will always be maintained.
- Residents and business will be notified when work is being performed on their street. **STAY INFORMED:** Receive regular updates on the Drought Pipeline Project by joining the information email list.
