

Amber Williamson, Director of Budget and Research, to discuss the upcoming budget hearings and budget process. Coffee and snacks will be provided.




PHN Cesar Chavez Community Engagement Scholarship

Phoenix Launches Community Survey Tool to Assess Resident Concerns

The City of Phoenix is launching a new public survey tool to better understand local priorities and concerns on a wide range of City services and the quality of life in Phoenix. The tool will enable the City to more holistically understand neighborhood issues and enhance our responsiveness to community priorities. The survey asks residents to evaluate their experience with different aspects of life in Phoenix including affordable housing, transportation, public safety and other City services.

"Phoenix is an innovative, data-driven city," said City Manager Jeff Barton. "We are always striving to get input from residents and this partnership with Zencity will be a great step forward in really understanding the needs and concerns of our residents so we can continue building the Phoenix of tomorrow."

Help Keep Phoenix Graffiti-Free in 2023

Did you know if you see graffiti in your neighborhood, you can report it and, in most cases, the City of Phoenix will remove it for free? Reporting graffiti is an easy way to help have a positive impact on your community.

In 2022, the Neighborhood Services Department (NSD) Graffiti Busters used nearly 12,000 gallons of paint to clean up approximately 50,000 sites of graffiti around

Phoenix. The Graffiti Busters work seven days a week, tracking down graffiti and responding to reports from residents. Crews can cover or remove up to 200 sites of graffiti every day, at no cost to residents or businesses.

Graffiti is a crime, so if you catch it in the act, call 911. Otherwise, if you see it in your neighborhood there are three ways you can report it and have it removed:

You can also take control of your neighborhood and help wipe out graffiti yourself. "We always encourage our residents to get involved in keeping their neighborhoods clean and free of blight," said Betsy Cable, the program manager. "Residents can get a group of volunteers together for a community clean-up and we will provide color-matched paint and supplies to help erase vandalism in your area."

The City of Phoenix does need permission from property owners to remove graffiti from private property. You can fill out a permission slip and learn more about getting graffiti removed from your property at Phoenix.gov/graffiti.



Budget Season and FundPHX

With City of Phoenix budget season upon on once again, residents can access FundPHX to build their own operating budget. FundPHX is an online tool designed to educate and engage the public in the City's annual budget process. The tool is available with the 2022-23 adopted budget in both English and Spanish and gives residents an opportunity to provide feedback on current funding levels and share community priorities with staff. Information collected in the tool from residents will be shared regularly with City Council so it can help guide development of the 2023-24 operating budget.

Volunteers Needed for Income Tax Assistance

Every year, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program prepares free tax returns for low-to-moderate-income individuals and families.

VITA volunteers receive free training and are certified by the IRS to prepare basic tax returns. Greeters, screeners, bilingual interpreters, and site coordinators are also needed.

Training is free and available online to complete at your own pace. You can become a volunteer with as little as 8 hours of training and get IRS certified with 24 hours of training.
