

Pool Season Opens May 25th



Phoenix Parks and Recreation Department staff are looking forward to seeing you all at City pools this summer. Please share these important details about pool operations and dates for swim lesson registration.

The department will open 16 pools all season long and an additional two pools, one in June and one in July, for a total of 18 pools this summer.

Pools open for the entire season (May 25-27 and June 1-July 28 (closed Fridays): Coronado, Cortez, Deer Valley, El Prado, Encanto, Falcon, Harmon, Madison, Maryvale, Paradise Valley, Pecos, Perry, Roosevelt, Starlight, Sunnyslope, Washington pools.

Select pools open for the extended season (August 3-4, 10-11, 17-18, 24-25 and August 31 - September 2) include Cortez, Encanto, Maryvale, Paradise Valley, Pecos, Perry, Roosevelt and Sunnyslope pools. These 8 pools will be open weekends through Labor Day.

Youth ages 17 and younger will receive FREE admission to swim at select Kool Kids pools thanks to donations from SRP and the Milwaukee Brewers.

Adults can swim for \$3 and seniors for \$1 (age 60 and older). All District 5 pools are Kool Kids pools:

- Starlight Pool, 7810 W. Osborn Road
- Washington Pool, 6655 N 23rd Ave.

Swim Lesson Enrollment Begins April 25th



Swim lessons at City pools will be available for adults and youth ages six months and older. **Registration for June classes begins on April 25, at 12 p.m**. Registration for July classes begins on June 14, at 12 p.m. Swim lesson dates are staggered throughout the summer, as listed below:

Session A: June 3-13

Session B: June 17-27

Session C: July 1-11

Session D: July 15-25

This summer we welcome back water exercise classes. Aqua Fit! Classes will be offered at select locations. Find a class time online at phoenix.gov/pools.


Swim Team Returns!

Library & Public Health Community Learning



The Office of Public Health and the Phoenix Public Library are partnering with Southwest Behavioral & Health Services to offer free community health education presentations in April and May. These community education events will increase community awareness on topics including how to talk to someone and support someone with substance use disorder, what is opioid overdose the causes and how to respond, how to talk to children about substances and reducing harms.

Since August 2023, 17 libraries citywide have made naloxone available to communities. Community health education will be presented in English on the following dates and library branches in District 5:

- April 23rd at Desert Sage Library at 11:00am

The Strategic Initiatives Team works all year long to bring awareness to important social issues impacting our community such as human trafficking, teen dating violence and HIV. They lead the public education campaign: Let's Talk Teal.

- The City first joined the Nationwide campaign in 2019 and hosts activities and shares resources to encourage the public to have important conversations to prevent sexual violence.
- The color teal was chosen to represent this campaign because it is associated with calm and healing.
- The City of Phoenix partners with the Arizona Coalition to End Sexual and
 Domestic Violence and the Sexual Assault Kit Initiative administered by the
 Bureau of Justice Assistance. As part of the partnership, the City of Phoenix holds
 monthly workgroup meetings focusing on four key areas:
- Teens and Youth: focusing on prevention and youth issues.
- o Education: focusing on building community capacity to appropriately respond to survivors of sexual assault.

- o Advocacy: focusing on identifying service gaps and improving service provision for survivors of sexual violence.
- Leadership: focusing on making Phoenix a national model and planning for
 Sexual Assault Awareness Month in April.
