



Street Improvements and Bike Lane Additions on Maryland Ave.



In an effort to improve our roadway and pedestrian safety and in direct response to our constituents, The City of Phoenix Street Transportation Department proposed an update to the parking and bike lanes on Maryland Avenue from 35th Avenue to the frontage road of Interstate-17. This summer, the street received mill and overlay treatment to repave the route.

Then, this fall there was a public meeting and a survey, to which the community responded. Much needed improvements include the installation of seven speed cushions, in addition to the buffered bike lanes. The timeline to complete the project is by the end of this fall. We're proud to support the neighborhood to request and approve the speed cushion installation. For more information, visit <u>the Street Transportation Maryland Avenue from 35th Avenue</u> to I-17. This is an effort of multiple departments in the City of Phoenix and community partners to work together, leveraging technology and community-based resources, to improve the safety and quality of life along 27th Ave. nearby the Black Canyon Highway.
