



Safety Tips for Trick-or-Treaters:

- Use a flashlight so you can be seen and be seen by others.
- Stay in a group and communicate where you will be going.
- Only go to homes with a porch light on.
- Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk. If no sidewalk is available, walk at the farthest edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- Never cut across yards or use alleys.
- Never enter a stranger's home or car for a treat.
- Obey all traffic and pedestrian regulations.
- Always walk. Never run across a street.
- Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks.
- Remove any mask or item that will limit eyesight before crossing a street, driveway or alley.
- Don't assume the right of way. Motorists may have trouble seeing Trick-or-Treaters. Just because one car stops, doesn't mean others will!
- No treats are to be eaten until they are thoroughly checked by an adult at home.

Haunted Houses

A Fire Department permit is required for all Haunted Houses that are open to the public. Requirements are, but not limited to.

- An automatic sprinkler system and an automatic fire detection system shall be installed. A Fire Alarm equipped with a voice evacuation system shall be installed.
- All construction and decorative materials shall be flame retardant.
- Emergency Exits shall be provided shall be visibly marked.
- Adult monitors with flashlights shall be available to provide assistance in the event someone becomes lost or disoriented.

If you are planning to attend a haunted house, follow these safety tips:

- Pay attention to the location of exits in the haunted house and stay on the approved path of travel and be cautious on or near stairs.
- Do not smoke, use lighters or matches.
- Avoid wearing loose-fitting clothing that could snag on props.
- Be aware that strobe lights may be in use.
