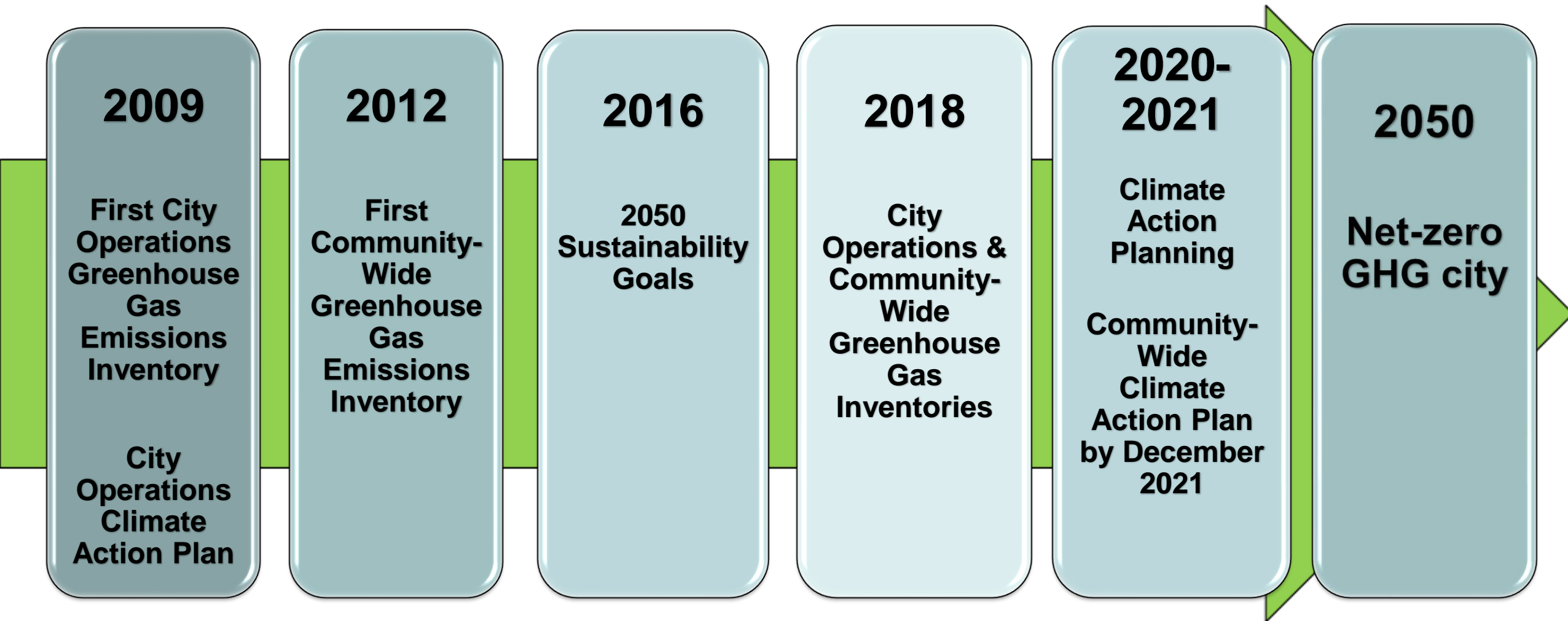
Introduction - C40 Cities



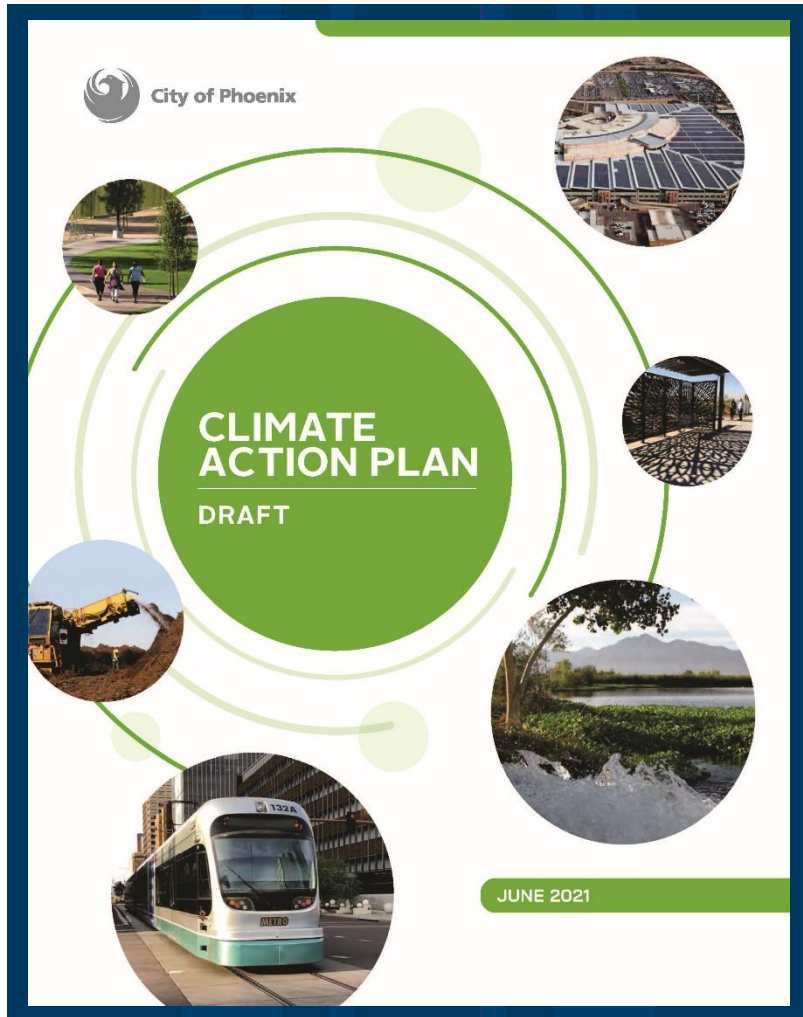
- Mayor Kate Gallego affirmed Phoenix commitment to the Paris Climate Accord – reduce GHG emissions by 2050
- Phoenix joined C40 Cities in Feb. 2020
- C40-compliant Climate Action Plan by Dec 2021
- **Deadline 2020** – 67% Reduction in GHG Emissions by 2030.

Goal 1:

Create a network of **80 cool corridors by 2030** in vulnerable communities to facilitate movement from residents' homes to their places of employment, education and play.

Goal 2:

Increase shade provided by trees or constructed shade to **25% by 2030** in parks, streets and right-of-way focusing on pedestrian areas prioritizing communities most vulnerable to heat.

Goal 3:

Provide resources and services to residents to manage heat.

Goal 4:

Increase the use of high albedo, or reflective, materials in infrastructure projects.

Goal 5:

Develop HeatReady certification for cities by 2025.

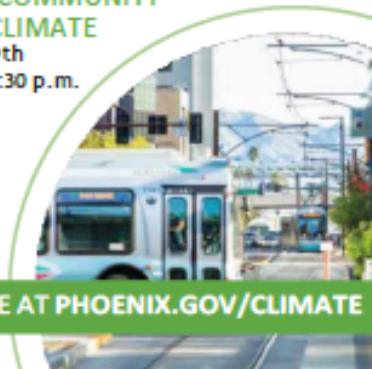
