Heat response planning

- Presentation to CCI Subcommittee 2/2
- Inventory of 15 city programs and services
- Initial concepts for 2022 improvements
- Coordinated plan to Council in early April

Hiring process

 Final stages of hiring process for Urban Tree Program Manager

 Built Environment Specialist position is open, closes Feb. 14



American Rescue Plan Act & OHRM

- Four OHRM programs presented 1/11
- Favorable discussion with Council and staff (Sustainability, Neighborhood Services, Public Transit)
- \$11M home weatherization (incl. mobile homes)
- \$7.5M residential tree equity accelerator
- \$3M trees for schools
- \$3M shade structures in public ROW

Residential Tree Equity Accelerator

- Increase tree canopy in low tree equity neighborhoods from 3.5% to 10.5%
 - 200 homes in each of 25 neighborhoods
 - 4 trees per home 20,000 trees total
 - 100 paid citizen foresters


Residential Tree Equity Accelerator – Prioritization?

 Neighborhood = census block group (~2,000 people, ~500-700 homes)

 Constrain to neighborhoods in Qualified Census Tracts (50% or more homes w/ less than 60% of area median income)

Qualified Census Tracts

(U.S. Department of Housing Office of Policy Development and Research)





Residential Tree Equity Accelerator – Prioritization?

 Constrain to neighborhoods with at least 50% single family/small multifamily

 Constrain to neighborhoods with minimum "plantable area" (parcel – building footprint)



Residential Tree Equity Accelerator – Prioritization?

Sort remaining CBGs by average residential parcel tree canopy/tree density

 Use ranked list to identify 5 geographic clusters of 5 proximate CBGs for a total of ~20,000 eligible homes

Review initial candidates with UHITS +?
