

Dear Client:

The following documents are needed to register in the Annual Facilities Program (AFP):

- <u>Application</u> This form must be sealed by the Registered Professional along with an address and phone number. An owner representative and phone number must be listed. Please return the original application, <u>not a copy</u>. Please include the nonrefundable application fee of \$500 along with the initial registration fee of \$750.00.
- Location Sheet Identify all building locations you wish to cover under the registration and the square footage of each, complete this sheet even if Registration is covering only one site. Provide occupancy and construction type per International Building Code (IBC) verbiage.
- 3. <u>Fiscal Responsibility</u> Let us know to whom the billing should be addressed and where statements should be sent to provide prompt payment.
- 4. <u>AFP Description</u> This document gives the history as well as an overview of the AFP Program and requires the signatures of **both** the individual representing the owner and of the agent for the registration.

On the location sheet, space is provided for you to identify each location by number or other designation if there are numerous locations. In the future, these designations may be incorporated to assist in identifying individual fees and inspections. This is optional you are not required to assign identifiers to participate in the program.

Please take time to read all information provided about the program and the codes involved. When registering with the program you are agreeing to comply with these standards set by the city of Phoenix.

Completed original applications, location sheets, fiscal responsibility forms, the \$500 nonrefundable application fee and the \$750 annual registration fee must be returned for processing. Your registration will be valid for 12 months from department approval.
