The following are general requirements and instructions for processing a Private Inspection Certificate for the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) and general information for persons responsible for these inspections.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The city of Phoenix will allow private inspections in lieu of city inspections for certain inspection types, including private IECC inspections. These private inspections include, but are not limited to, observation of the work assigned for conformance with the approved design drawings and specifications, and submission of appropriate inspection reports to the city Inspector and registered design professional in responsible charge.

The private Inspector shall be a qualified person who demonstrates competence to the satisfaction of the Planning & Development Department for the type of work utilizing private inspection. The city shall rely on the owner to determine the individual(s) qualified to perform each type of test or inspection. These individual(s) shall be responsible for performing the private inspection tasks and reports required by the City Code and Planning & Development Department guidelines.

The private IECC inspector(s) shall be independent from the installing contractor or any other person responsible for the work.

INSTRUCTIONS

OWNER: Complete all information requested on this form. Indicate the TYPES OF WORK requiring private IECC Inspections and the INDIVIDUAL(S) qualified and authorized to perform each such inspection. Include the CERTIFICATION NUMBER for each individual and sign and date the form. Submit to the city with the permit application whenever private inspections will be used in lieu of city inspections. This form may be reproduced in the construction plans in lieu of submitting separate sheets. **Sign and date the original form after the final inspection report has been reviewed.**

PLAN REVIEWER: Review the Private Inspection Certificate for accuracy and ensure that it identifies all work utilizing private inspections. Complete any missing information (i.e., project and/or permit numbers) if known. Check the appropriate Permit Category Checkbox when setting up the permit and clarify in the scope of the permit those items that will be inspected through privatized inspections. The Private Inspection Certificate shall be processed before permit issuance.

CITY BUILDING INSPECTOR: Review the Private Inspection Certificate for the types of work using private inspections and the names of the individual(s) authorized to perform private inspections. Discuss private inspections requirements with the contractor and private inspector at pre-job conference. Review all inspection reports, required correction notices and final reports. Submit final Private Inspection Certificate to Records for inclusion in project file.

PRIVATE IECC INSPECTOR: The individual(s) responsible for the private IECC inspections shall complete a signed written report after each site visit requiring private inspection. The private inspector(s) shall ensure that all reports are posted with the permit at the job site and are available to the city of Phoenix Building Inspector for review. All discrepancies shall be brought to the immediate attention of the contractor for correction and, if uncorrected, to the owner, registered design professional in responsible charge and city of Phoenix building inspector.

The private inspector shall initial next to the completed item on the Private Inspection Certificate and submit a **final signed report** to the registered design professional in responsible charge and to the city of Phoenix building inspector stating whether the items requiring IECC inspection were, to the best of the inspector's knowledge, in compliance with the approved plans and specifications and applicable workmanship provisions of the code. Final inspection approval and/or issuance of a Certificate of Completion or Certificate of Occupancy will not occur until Private IECC Inspection Certificate and final reports have been received and accepted by the city of Phoenix building inspector.

To be considered qualified, the IECC private inspector must possess one of the following certifications: Arizona Registered Professional Engineer or Architect, ICC Commercial Energy Inspector, ICC Residential Energy Inspector/Plans Examiner or Home Energy Rating Systems Inspector.
