YOUR CITY, YOUR PLAN

Phoenix voters approved a 35-year transportation plan in August 2015, known as Transportation 2050 (T2050). The citywide plan was shaped by Phoenix residents, following significant community input and the work of the council-appointed Citizens Committee on the Future of Phoenix Transportation.

What does the plan do?

- Expands and upgrades Phoenix's transit system
- Enables more frequent street maintenance and improvements
- Redefines Phoenix transportation as multi-modal
- Supports greater access to education and employment

Who oversees the plan?


- Public input shapes direction of plan
- Citizens Transportation Commission (CTC)
 provides oversight
- Phoenix City Council approves implementation

Funding is made possible by you

- Derived from a seven-tenths of a cent city sales tax
- Local funds generate almost half of the plan's
 overall cost
- Fares and federal and county funds round out the \$31.5 billion plan

How your money will be directed

- More bus service
 (added hours and frequency)
- Expanded Dial-a-Ride service
- High-capacity transit (rail, bus rapid transit and urban circulator)
- Street maintenance and modernization
- Facility and infrastructure upgrades



REAL RESULTS, RIGHT NOW

Bus

- Expanded service hours and improved frequency starting October 2016
- Further expansion of hours to match light rail
- Additional bus stop shade structures
- New Dial-a-Ride vehicles and buses
- New RAPID buses
- Increased security on bus and light rail

Light rail/high-capacity transit

- 42 miles of new light rail
- New light rail station to increase access
- 75 miles of bus rapid transit
- 5 miles of an urban circulator

Streets

- 680 miles of new asphalt on major arterial streets
- 1,080 miles of new bicycle lanes
- 135 miles of new sidewalks
- 2,000 new street lights
- Major street improvements new roads, bridges
 and street modernization
