Drought Pipeline Project Ongoing Safety Awareness

- Work areas and excavations will be fenced and secure.
 The fencing will provide a visual barrier as depicted in the photo to the right.
- All gates will be closed and locked outside of working hours.
- Trenches will be covered when work is not being performed.
- Traffic control signs and barriers will be clear and organized.
- There will be designated pedestrian walkways provided when sidewalks are impacted by construction work.
- Residents and business will be notified when work is being performed on their street.
- Dust control is required and is accomplished by water trucks
- There will be some noise during daytime work hours there will not be unnecessary noise.
- We are coordinating closely with the Police and Fire Departments—emergency access will always be maintained.
