



The City of Phoenix has contracted with Kiewit Corporation and Achen Gardner Construction to install the Drought Pipeline Project in the area south of the Phoenix Mountains Preserve.

Beginning **February 14, 2022** installation of the 66” pipeline will begin crossing Glendale Avenue at 21st Street. This activity is scheduled to take approximately 6-8 weeks.

- 21st Street at Glendale Avenue closed. Through traffic only on Glendale Avenue.
- No left turns from Glendale Avenue into Chabad-Lubavitch of Arizona parking lot.
- No left turns exiting Chabad-Lubavitch of Arizona parking lot onto Glendale Avenue.

### Chabad-Lubavitch of Arizona

#### Alternate Vehicle Access:

Eastbound travelers on Glendale Avenue can access Chabad-Lubavitch of Arizona:

- Turning left from Glendale Avenue onto 20th Street (north),
- Right onto Myrtle Avenue (east),
- Right onto 22nd Street (south),
- Right onto Glendale Avenue (west),
- Right into Chabad-Lubavitch parking lot (north).
